SUMMARY OF RULES.

- 1. The Society shall be called the Hodder Valley Agricultural and Horticultural Society.
- 2. The Society shall consist of a President, Chairperson , Treasurer, Secretary, Directors and General Committee.
- 3. The Society shall be supported by Donations, Fund Raising and Annual Subscriptions.
- 4. All classes are open unless specified as Local. Local entries are confined to residents of the Hodder Watershed above Burholme Bridge and to the members of Slaidburn YFC.
- 5. All Exhibits must have been in the possession or under the cultivation of the Exhibitor at least 28 days prior to the date of the Show. Animals being exhibited must have been the bona fide property of the Exhibitor for 28 days on Show Day. Certificates will be required if necessary
- 6. If anyone procures any specimen from another, and exhibits it as their own production, they shall, if it is proved satisfactory to the Committee, forfeit all prizes awarded to them and be barred from exhibiting again for a period of 3 years. The Committee reserves the right to examine the garden and glass-house of any Exhibitor prior to, or after the Show, and any Exhibitor refusing them admission will be disqualified.
- 7. All intending Exhibitors shall enter with the Secretary on or before the day fixed for the closing of the entries, and no entries shall be accepted unless sent with the fee in a sealed envelope OR paid online in full. All entries to be in no later than 18:00 hours 25th August 2023- this date to be strictly enforced. No late entries will be accepted.
- 8. The Committee reserves the right to refuse or accept any entry or to cancel any Class not having any competition. That the entry fees of Stock etc. not exhibited shall be forfeited
- 9. Suitable persons shall be appointed to examine stock previous to their being taken before the Judges and they shall have the power to disqualify all animals which may be entered in the wrong Class or which may be of other than the specified age.
- Any cattle having cast a tooth making it ineligible for the Class entered will be transferred to the next appropriate Class.
- 11. Tampering with livestock will result in disqualification This includes but is not a definitive list Cows or heifers in milk should not have teat sealants applied, Setting of teats is prohibited and the administration of tranquillisers, sedatives or other drugs which affect the behaviour of the animal is prohibited
- 12. No animal should be shown if it has been bred or owned by the Judge
- 13. Children should not be allowed to handle bulls or any large, fractious animal. An adult should always be in attendance to take over if a child is having difficulty maintaining control of any animal.

- 14. The advice in the Approved Code of Practice "Preventing Accidents to Children in Agriculture" should be followed at all times.
- 15. All bulls aged 9 months and over must have a ring through their nose. This is stated in the Health and Safety Regulations Guidance Note GS36 regarding handling of bulls at agricultural shows. Bull exhibitors should acquaint themselves with this legislation.
- 16. Any animal thought to be unsafe for the general public will not be allowed into the cattle tents.
- 17. Exhibitors must ensure that their animals are properly halter trained before the Show.
- 18. All animals will be checked for their halters being on correctly and any animal found to be incorrectly haltered will not be allowed to enter the ring.
- 19. It is advised that all Beef Cattle should be shown with nose clips. Bulls see Rule 15
- 20. The use of electrical equipment will be allowed in restricted areas only.
- 21. The Judge shall have the right to reserve any prize where the Exhibit may be considered unworthy of it, or where there is insufficient competition, also awarding extra prizes for merit.
- 22. All Prize Money will be available to be collected by the Exhibitor on Show Day.
- 23. That all objections shall be in writing and lodged with the Secretary together with a deposit of £10 on the day of the Exhibition. The onus (or otherwise) to rest with the objector. The objections to be decided by the Committee of Directors whose decision shall be final and not subject to any legal ruling.
- 24. All matters of dispute arising during the existence of the Society not otherwise provided for in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Committee OF Directors, whose decision shall be final.
- 25. **SPECIAL WARNING.** The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident, loss or damage which may happen to any Exhibit. or for any accident which may happen to Members, Riders, Exhibitors or Spectators upon the field or otherwise.
- 26. ALL EXHIBITS AND LIVESTOCK MUST BE STAGED IN THE SHOW TENTS OR ON THE FIELD BY 9.30 am FOR JUDGING. NONE TO BE REMOVED BEFORE 4.30 pm., (EXCEPT COW OR HEIFER ENTRIES WHICH MAY BE REMOVED AFTER THE GRAND PARADE) OR PRIZE MONEY MAY BE WITHHELD. Stewards will assess the safety of access for Animals arriving after the livestock gates close at 9.30. They may be refused entry.
- 27. In all cases, the Judges` decision will be final. Three members of the Committee will be empowered to settle any dispute for which the Rules do not provide.
- 28. The Exhibits will not be distinguished by the name of the Feeder, Breeder or the Owner until the premiums are awarded, but by the ticket or numbers affixed to each lot corresponding to the list made by the Secretary. No Officer or Steward other than the Class Steward is allowed into to the Ring whilst the animals are being judged, and no person showing any animal must wear an official badge in the Ring.

- 29. No person may be allowed to show, point out or cause to be pointed out to the Judges of Stock etc. his own animals or those of his competitors, in private or on the Show Field, or during the time of showing, or make any observations to the Judge respecting any animal, or divulge the name of any animal being exhibited, and no animal will be removed until called upon by the Judges. Any person or persons who shall be detected violating this regulation shall, for this offence, be disqualified from competing for, or receiving any of the Society's prizes.
- 30. All Prize Winners in the Cattle Classes to participate in the Grand Parade or prize money will be withheld, and no Prize Winner to leave the field until paraded.
- 31. The Committee retains the right to replace any Cash Prize by a Special Prize of not less than equal value.
- 32. Where Special Prizes are given to a particular Class by a named person or Company, and if the Special Prize, shall be of more value than the prize offered by the Society, the Special Prize shall be the only award for that class.

ALL RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO

Disclaimer Exhibitors are responsible for complying with all regulations from all statutory bodies including all movement licences and restrictions. We also reserve the right to cancel any classes or indeed the show, should abandonment be absolutely necessary. Refunds will not be made. Exhibitors enter the show field at their own risk. The Hodder Valley Agricultural & Horticultural Society Ltd and its members, secretary and directors accept no responsibility for any losses incurred on the show field. Exhibitors should ensure that they have adequate insurance.

ALL CATTLE TO BE ON THE SHOW FIELD BY 09.30 HOURS FOR JUDGING

All Exhibitors to please ensure you comply with the relevant authorities advice over movements and biosecurity.

e.g. If you intend to show stock at less than 7 day intervals ensure you have held them in an APHA approved isolation unit and complied with APHA.

Cattle Section Additional Information

Note: Any cattle exhibited at the Show require a Passport to be presented .

All Cattle must have official identification tags fitted in line with current regulations and passports must be presented on show day. (The Signature of the secretary or Chief Steward for the movement will suffice) **NEW CPH 21/677/8107**

The TB testing exemption covering cattle movements to agricultural shows was revised on 1st July 2012 as follows: Pre-movement testing of cattle in high TB risk herds (i.e. herds with a routine TB testing interval of 1 or 2 years) will be required for movements to shows if cattle will be at the show for more than 24 hours and/or housed i.e. kept inside at the showground. Previously, pre-movement testing was not required when animals were moved to shows provided they were either returned to the farm of origin or went to slaughter after the show. The exemption will remain for movements to shows where cattle are not held for more than 24 hours and are not housed. A clear pre-movement test is valid for 60 days from the date of the test. Therefore animals can be moved to more than one show during that post-test period provided that the last movement back to the home premises – or to slaughter, if applicable - is completed within 60 days of the test date. Owners must ensure they do not book a TB test to take place within 60 days of completion of the previous TB test as this will not be regarded as an authorised test. Hodder Valley Show cannot be held responsible in regard to TB testing, it is up to the exhibitor to ensure correct procedures have been followed. For general information on pre-movement testing, please see the Defra website: http://www.defra.gov.uk/animal-diseases/a-z/bovinetb/animal-keepers/testing/

From 2016 Post Movement TB Testing has been introduced in certain circumstances. Hodder Valley Show is not currently affected as the cattle are not on the showground for more than 24 hours and are not housed in a building with sides on. We are therefore exempt from pre and post movement testing. Please note Hodder Valley Show is not responsible if these circumstances change.

Cattle must only be shown in **ONE** class (excluding YFC) and then forwarded to the relevant specials as necessary.

ALL CATTLE TO BE ON THE SHOW FIELD BY 09.30 HOURS FOR JUDGING

All Exhibitors to please ensure you comply with the relevant authorities advice over movements and biosecurity.

e.g. If you intend to show stock at less than 7 day intervals ensure you have held them in an APHA approved isolation unit and complied with APHA RULES.

Maedi Visna Accredited Exhibits . Facilities will be provided this year for Maedi Visna Accredited Sheep to be judged in their own livestock area but within the same classes as "Non Accredited". Please indicate on entry form which sheep are accredited. Exhibitors must produce their current M.V. certificate before unloading any accredited sheep and adhere to all Health Scheme rules. Failure to provide correct documentation will result in Exhibitors being disqualified .

*** Sheep Scab ***

Any sheep deemed to be showing signs of Sheep Scab will be isolated and must be returned to the holding which they were licensed from.

As the disease is becoming more prevalent we would like to politely request that all Sheep brought to the Show have been treated with either:

- 1. A Scab approved Dip. Plunge dipped and adhering to the Data Sheet instructions within the 60 days preceding the show OR
- Treated with relevant ML Injectable's as below.
 Dectomax within 14 days prior to show or Cydectin 2% within 60 days

This will help to protect the sheep on the showfield, Exhibitors and Judges returning to their own flocks and our host's farm and livestock

Baked Bean Tin Mini Fruit Cake - Makes 6 - Only one to be entered.

150g butter or margarine 175g plain Flour

150g soft brown sugar ½ tsp ground mixed spice

1 grated lemon rind ½ tsp ground nutmeg

1 tbsp black treacle 500g dried mixed fruit

3 large eggs 50g glace cherries

40g ground almonds 50g chopped almonds

Pre-heat oven to 180C/350F/Gas Mark

Cream butter, sugar and lemon rind, add the treacle. Add the eggs alternatively with the flour and spices. Fold in fruit and remaining ingredients.

Grease and double line side and base of six small baked bean tins with greaseproof paper leaving 2cms above tin.

Bake for 15 minutes at above temperatures and then reduce to 140C/275F/Gas Mark 1 and bake for another hour or until cooked.

Lemon Drizzle Cake

4oz (100g) Soft Marg

4tbsp Milk

6 oz (150g) SR Flour Sieved

2 Eggs - whisked

1tsp Baking Powder

1 Grated Lemon Rind

6oz (150g) Caster Sugar

Method

Place all ingredients in a large bowl and beat with electric mixer for 2/3 minutes – until pale in colour. Place in a 2lb Loaf Tin. Bake at 180°C for 30-40 minutes

Topping – Juice of one lemon and 4oz sugar. Mix together and pour over cake when removed from the oven. Leave in tin until cold
